Burleson County Fair Queen

The Burleson County Fair Association is seeking nominations for the 2023 BCFA Queen. Applications are being accepted until May 26th. A Queen Contestant Meeting will be held June 1, 2023 at 6:30 PM at the BCFA Expo Center. Ticket sales will begin after that meeting.

Contestants must be a female sophomore, junior or senior at the time of the contest and reside in Burleson County. She must be a member in good standing in either 4-H, FFA or FCCLA and have a fair project for the 2023 fair.

BCFA Queen Contestant Rules to note for 2023.

1. Contestants are required to have at least 1 (one) civic sponsor to compete in the contest. (Examples: 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, SPJST, Lions Club, EEA, etc.) Contestants may not be sponsored by businesses.
 2. Contestants must have a parade entry in the Burleson County Fair Parade, but the entry does not have to be a float. Only float entries will be considered for the queen float parade winner award/money.
 3. Contestants will be required to sell memberships.
 4. Check and cash are the only accepted forms of payment for individual memberships. Online tickets are available for purchase (through the fair association) as well. If memberships are purchased with cash, cash should be turned in. Memberships should not be purchased through electronic cash apps such as Venmo, Paypal, etc.
 5. No candidate can promote themselves as a candidate before the mandatory meeting on June 1st. Any candidate who promoted themselves before June 1st will be grounds for disqualification of the candidate. This includes contacting businesses, organizations, or people directly. This also includes posting to social media about purchasing fair tickets prior to when the candidate receives her tickets on June 1st.
 6. Contestants may not advertise their flyers on social media or hang them in businesses until after June 1st when they receive their tickets.
 7. Contestants are not allowed to offer incentives to purchase tickets, other than the raffle prizes listed on the BCFA membership to be drawn for with the purchase of the individual membership. Contestants will not advertise businesses as sponsors in any way.

EVENT REIMBURSEMENT—In order to be reimbursed for ANY 4-H event you must fill out and turn in a reimbursement form. After the form has been turned in it will be reviewed and voted on by the ALA. Forms can be picked up at the Extension Office or emailed. **Forms must be turned in within 10 days of the event.**

ALLIANCE PARTNERS—Texas 4-H Alliance Members have special programs set up for Texas 4-H members, their families and supporters of the program. 4-H HORSE VALIDATION

Horse validation opens on March 1st and must be completed by May 1st. Here are some tips that will be helpful in preparations.

Horses must be validated each year.

Validations are conducted online through your 4-H online profile.

Riders MUST be active 4-H members to validate.

Digital pictures are required for validation.

Validations are paid on-line by credit/debit card.

The family can submit payment of \$10.00 per horse (\$20.00 after April 15th, or \$250 from May 1st to May 5th), in the form of a credit card ONLY.
